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SENATE BILL No. 298

April 28, 2015, Introduced by Senators KNEZEK, JONES, BIEDA, HOOD, O'BRIEN, HERTEL, BRANDENBURG, SCHUITMAKER, HOPGOOD, SCHMIDT, EMMONS, KNOLLENBERG, PROOS, ANANICH, NOFS, HORN, YOUNG, WARREN, HILDENBRAND, ZORN, ROCCA, MARLEAU, ROBERTSON, BOOHER and GREGORY and referred to the Committee on Veterans, Military Affairs and Homeland Security.

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled
"The Michigan penal code,"
by amending sections 50a and 502c (MCL 750.50a and 750.502c),
section 50a as added by 1994 PA 42 and section 502c as amended by
1998 PA 38.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 50a. (1) An individual shall not do either of the following:
- (a) Willfully and maliciously assault, beat, harass, injure,
- or attempt to assault, beat, harass, or injure a dog AN ANIMAL that
 he or she knows or has reason to believe is a quide or leader dog
- 5 for a blind individual, a hearing dog for a deaf or audibly
- 7 impaired individual, or a service dog ANIMAL for a physically
- 8 limited individual.PERSON WITH A DISABILITY.
- 9 (b) Willfully and maliciously impede or interfere with, or 01492'15
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- ${f 1}$ attempt to impede or interfere with, duties performed by ${f a}$ dog ${f AN}$
- 2 ANIMAL that he or she knows or has reason to believe is a guide or
- 3 leader dog for a blind individual, a hearing dog for a deaf or
- 4 audibly impaired individual, or a service dog-ANIMAL for a
- 5 physically limited individual.PERSON WITH A DISABILITY.
- 6 (2) An individual who violates subsection (1) is guilty of a
- 7 misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or
- 8 a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.
- 9 (3) In a prosecution for a violation of subsection (1),
- 10 evidence that the defendant initiated or continued conduct directed
- 11 toward a dog AN ANIMAL described in subsection (1) after being
- 12 requested to avoid or discontinue that conduct or similar conduct
- 13 by a blind, deaf, audibly impaired, or physically limited
- 14 individual PERSON WITH A DISABILITY being served or assisted by the
- 15 dog ANIMAL shall give rise to a rebuttable presumption that the
- 16 conduct was initiated or continued maliciously.
- 17 (4) A conviction and imposition of a sentence under this
- 18 section does not prevent a conviction and imposition of a sentence
- 19 under any other applicable provision of law.
- 20 (5) As used in this section:
- 21 (a) "Audibly impaired" means the inability to hear air
- 22 conduction thresholds at an average of 40 decibels or greater in
- 23 the individual's better ear.
- 24 (b) "Blind" means having a visual acuity of 20/200 or less in
- 25 the individual's better eye with correction, or having a limitation
- 26 of the individual's field of vision such that the widest diameter
- 27 of the visual field subtends an angular distance not greater than

- 1 20 degrees.
- 2 (c) "Deaf" means the individual's hearing is totally impaired
- 3 or the individual's hearing, with or without amplification, is so
- 4 seriously impaired that the primary means of receiving spoken
- 5 language is through other sensory input, including, but not limited
- 6 to, lip reading, sign language, finger spelling, or reading.
- 7 (A) (d) "Harass" means to engage in any conduct directed
- 8 toward a guide, leader, hearing, or service dog AN ANIMAL DESCRIBED
- 9 IN SUBSECTION (1) that is likely to impede or interfere with the
- 10 dog's ANIMAL'S performance of its duties or that places the blind,
- 11 deaf, audibly impaired, or physically limited individual PERSON
- 12 WITH A DISABILITY being served or assisted by the dog-ANIMAL in
- 13 danger of injury.
- 14 (B) (e) "Injure" means to cause any physical injury to a dog
- 15 AN ANIMAL described in subsection (1).
- 16 (C) (f) "Maliciously" means any of the following:
- 17 (i) With intent to assault, beat, harass, or injure $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$
- 18 ANIMAL described in subsection (1).
- 19 (ii) With intent to impede or interfere with duties performed
- 20 by a dog AN ANIMAL described in subsection (1).
- 21 (iii) With intent to disturb, endanger, or cause emotional
- 22 distress to a blind, deaf, audibly impaired, or physically limited
- 23 individual PERSON WITH A DISABILITY being served or assisted by a
- 24 dog AN ANIMAL described in subsection (1).
- 25 (iv) With knowledge that the individual's conduct will $\frac{1}{\sqrt{1-1}}$ or is
- 26 likely to harass or injure a dog AN ANIMAL described in subsection
- **27** (1).

- 1 (v) With knowledge that the individual's conduct will \overline{r} or is
- 2 likely to impede or interfere with duties performed by a dog AN
- 3 ANIMAL described in subsection (1).
- 4 (vi) With knowledge that the individual's conduct will $\frac{1}{v}$ or is
- 5 likely to disturb, endanger, or cause emotional distress to a
- 6 blind, deaf, audibly impaired, or physically limited individual
- 7 PERSON WITH A DISABILITY being served or assisted by a dog AN
- 8 ANIMAL described in subsection (1).
- 9 <u>(g) "Physically limited" means having limited ambulatory</u>
- 10 abilities and includes but is not limited to having a temporary or
- 11 permanent impairment or condition that does 1 or more of the
- 12 following:
- 14 difficulty or insecurity.
- 15 (ii) Affects sight or hearing to the extent that an individual
- 16 is insecure or exposed to danger.
- 17 (iii) Causes faulty coordination.
- 19 perceptiveness.
- 20 (D) "PERSON WITH A DISABILITY" MEANS A PERSON WHO SATISFIES
- 21 ALL OF THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:
- 22 (i) HAS A PHYSICAL OR MENTAL IMPAIRMENT THAT SUBSTANTIALLY
- 23 LIMITS 1 OR MORE MAJOR LIFE ACTIVITIES.
- 24 (ii) HAS A HISTORY OR RECORD OF AN IMPAIRMENT DESCRIBED IN
- 25 SUBPARAGRAPH (i).
- 26 (iii) IS PERCEIVED BY OTHER PERSONS AS HAVING AN IMPAIRMENT
- 27 DESCRIBED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (i).

- 1 (E) AS USED IN SUBDIVISION (D), "PERSON WITH A DISABILITY"
- 2 INCLUDES A VETERAN WHO HAS BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH 1 OR MORE OF THE
- 3 FOLLOWING:
- 4 (i) POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER.
- 5 (ii) TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY.
- 6 (iii) OTHER SERVICE-RELATED DISABILITIES.
- 7 (F) "SERVICE ANIMAL" MEANS A DOG OR A MINIATURE HORSE THAT IS
- 8 ON A LEASH, HARNESS, OR OTHER TETHER AND UNDER THE CONTROL OF ITS
- 9 HANDLER THAT HAS BEEN INDIVIDUALLY TRAINED TO DO WORK OR PERFORM
- 10 TASKS FOR THE BENEFIT OF A PERSON WITH A DISABILITY, INCLUDING A
- 11 PHYSICAL, SENSORY, PSYCHIATRIC, INTELLECTUAL, OR OTHER MENTAL
- 12 DISABILITY.
- 13 (G) "VETERAN" MEANS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 14 (i) A PERSON WHO PERFORMED MILITARY SERVICE IN THE ARMED
- 15 FORCES FOR A PERIOD OF MORE THAN 90 DAYS AND SEPARATED FROM THE
- 16 ARMED FORCES IN A MANNER OTHER THAN A DISHONORABLE DISCHARGE.
- 17 (ii) A PERSON DISCHARGED OR RELEASED FROM MILITARY SERVICE
- 18 BECAUSE OF A SERVICE-RELATED DISABILITY.
- 19 (iii) A MEMBER OF A RESERVE BRANCH OF THE ARMED FORCES AT THE
- 20 TIME HE OR SHE WAS ORDERED TO MILITARY SERVICE DURING A PERIOD OF
- 21 WAR, OR IN A CAMPAIGN OR EXPEDITION FOR WHICH A CAMPAIGN BADGE IS
- 22 AUTHORIZED, AND WAS RELEASED FROM MILITARY SERVICE IN A MANNER
- 23 OTHER THAN A DISHONORABLE DISCHARGE.
- Sec. 502c. (1) A person who is an owner, lessee, proprietor,
- 25 manager, superintendent, agent, or employee of any place of public
- 26 or private housing, accommodation, amusement, or recreation,
- 27 including but not limited to any inn, hotel, motel, apartment

- 1 building, trailer park, restaurant, barbershop, billiard parlor,
- 2 store, public conveyance on land or water, theater, motion picture
- 3 house, public or private educational institution, or elevator, who
- 4 refuses to permit a person with disabilities A DISABILITY to enter
- 5 or use the place when the place is available because the person
- 6 with disabilities A DISABILITY is being led or accompanied by a
- 7 guide or leader dog, hearing dog, or service dog ANIMAL is guilty
- 8 of a misdemeanor. if the guide or leader dog is wearing a harness
- 9 or if the hearing dog or service dog is wearing a blaze orange
- 10 leash and collar, hearing dog cape, or service dog backpack, and
- 11 the person with disabilities being led or accompanied has in his or
- 12 her possession a pictured identification card certifying that the
- 13 dog was trained by a qualified organization or trainer. The
- 14 department of labor shall maintain a list of organizations or
- 15 trainers that train guide or leader dogs, hearing dogs, and service
- 16 dogs.
- 17 (2) A person who is an owner, lessee, proprietor, manager,
- 18 superintendent, agent, or employee of any place of public or
- 19 private housing, accommodation, amusement, or recreation,
- 20 including, but not limited to, the places listed in subsection (1),
- 21 who refuses to permit a trainer of guide or leader dogs, hearing
- 22 dogs, or A service dogs ANIMAL to enter or use the place when the
- 23 place is available because the trainer is being led or accompanied
- 24 by a guide or leader dog, hearing dog, or service dog ANIMAL is
- 25 guilty of a misdemeanor. if the guide or leader dog is wearing a
- 26 harness or if the hearing dog or service dog is wearing a hearing
- 27 dog cape or service dog backpack, if the trainer is being led or

- 1 accompanied by an adult dog for the purpose of training the dog,
- 2 and if the trainer has in his or her possession picture
- 3 identification and identification stating that he or she is a
- 4 representative or employee of an organization or trainer, or is a
- 5 trainer, included on the department of labor list of organizations
- 6 or trainers that train guide or leader dogs, hearing dogs, or
- 7 service dogs.
- 8 (3) As used in this section:
- 9 (a) "Adult dog" means a domestic dog of the species canis
- 10 familiaris that is 12 months of age or older.
- 11 (b) "Audibly impaired" means audibly impaired as defined in
- 12 section 1 of 1981 PA 82, MCL 752.61.
- 13 (c) "Blind person" means a blind person as defined in section
- 14 1 of 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351.
- 15 (d) "Deaf person" means a deaf person as defined in section 1
- 16 of 1981 PA 82, MCL 752.61.
- 17 (A) (e) "Person with disabilities" A DISABILITY" means a
- 18 person who is audibly impaired, blind, deaf, or otherwise
- 19 physically limited. SATISFIES ALL OF THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:
- 20 (i) HAS A PHYSICAL OR MENTAL IMPAIRMENT THAT SUBSTANTIALLY
- 21 LIMITS 1 OR MORE MAJOR LIFE ACTIVITIES.
- 22 (ii) HAS A HISTORY OR RECORD OF AN IMPAIRMENT DESCRIBED IN
- 23 SUBPARAGRAPH (i).
- 24 (iii) IS PERCEIVED BY OTHER PERSONS AS HAVING AN IMPAIRMENT
- 25 DESCRIBED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (i).
- 26 (f) "Physically limited" means physically limited as defined
- 27 in section 1 of 1966 PA 1, MCL 125.1351.

- 1 (B) AS USED IN SUBDIVISION (A), "PERSON WITH A DISABILITY"
- 2 INCLUDES A VETERAN WHO HAS BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH 1 OR MORE OF THE
- 3 FOLLOWING:
- 4 (i) POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER.
- 5 (ii) TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY.
- 6 (iii) OTHER SERVICE-RELATED DISABILITIES.
- 7 (C) "SERVICE ANIMAL" MEANS A DOG OR A MINIATURE HORSE THAT IS
- 8 ON A LEASH, HARNESS, OR OTHER TETHER AND UNDER THE CONTROL OF ITS
- 9 HANDLER THAT HAS BEEN INDIVIDUALLY TRAINED TO DO WORK OR PERFORM
- 10 TASKS FOR THE BENEFIT OF A PERSON WITH A DISABILITY, INCLUDING A
- 11 PHYSICAL, SENSORY, PSYCHIATRIC, INTELLECTUAL, OR OTHER MENTAL
- 12 DISABILITY.
- 13 (D) "VETERAN" MEANS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 14 (i) A PERSON WHO PERFORMED MILITARY SERVICE IN THE ARMED
- 15 FORCES FOR A PERIOD OF MORE THAN 90 DAYS AND SEPARATED FROM THE
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- 20 TIME HE OR SHE WAS ORDERED TO MILITARY SERVICE DURING A PERIOD OF
- 21 WAR, OR IN A CAMPAIGN OR EXPEDITION FOR WHICH A CAMPAIGN BADGE IS
- 22 AUTHORIZED, AND WAS RELEASED FROM MILITARY SERVICE IN A MANNER
- 23 OTHER THAN A DISHONORABLE DISCHARGE.
